# ASIA

### INDIA: Medical & Health Work, Teaching & Care Work Departs: June, November & January, \$2890

Placements are based in the mountainous region of Palampur, or by the beautiful beaches of Goa. Teach English to local children, work in women's empowerment groups or use your skills and knowledge to provide health education and work in local hospitals and clinics.

### TIMORE LESTE: Health Work, Teaching & Construction Departs: July, November & January, \$3295

Live and work in the newest nation in the world, right on our doorstep. Based in Dili, students can work on teaching English,

sport and art in local primary schools. As well as helping with a construction project for the school. Health Science students (Physio & OT) can work at a rehabilitation hospital and also participate in their community rehabilitation program.
